

SAFETY

41% of women in Arizona have been a victim of sexual violence. Almost half of the perpetrators were a current or former intimate partner.

This **reduction** of Maricopa County's rape kit backlog has led to 12 convictions and 14 indictments.



Over 2/3rds of these homicides were committed with guns.







 - Family caregiving (Elder care)
 - Family coordinator
 - Reproductive health
 - Domestic responsibilities
 - Leadership roles





Women and the Pandemic

- Job losses have hit women harder than men
- More women in service-related jobs
 - More furloughs
 - More frontline exposures (health care workers, childcare workers)
- Women of color are at the intersection of inequities
- Women carry the larger share of Domestic responsibilities which have amplified
- Home schooling/work from Home
 - Childcare
 - Extended family care
